As far back as I can remember I used to hear that Lewis and

Caroline Carson were married many years ago and very soon after uncle Carson came out of the army. I have heard him say, time and again, that he and aunt Caroline were married and then too, I have heard aunt Caroline say many times that she was married to Lewis Carson just after he came out of the army.

I know that aunt Caroline and Lewis Carson were living together as man and wife when he died. I disremember the date that Lewis Carson died but he died some time in the month of April and in the year 1916. I saw his body after he died. I have been about aunt Caroline Carson a greatdeal since her husband died and I know that she has not remarried. She is too old and she is now almost blind and has no body to care for her but my father and my mother.

I am not financially interested in this case, I have heard this statement read and it is correct.
